From the Senior Pastor

[Our Sunday evening Pastor's Bible study recently discussed the 22 questions below. These questions, with their roots in the birth of the Methodist movement, continue to aid disciples to follow Jesus almost three centuries later as we "Encourage one another daily... so that none of you may be hardened by sin's deceitfulness." Hebrews 3:13]

In 1729, while Methodism's founder John Wesley was a student at Oxford, he started a club with his brother Charles, a group soon mockingly dubbed "The Holy Club" by classmates. The Holy Club never exceeded twenty-five members, but many of those made significant contributions to the rise of evangelical Christianity in the 1700's. In addition to Charles and John Wesley, the group included George Whitefield, a primary force in both the Great Awakening in America and the Evangelical Revival in England.

John Wesley saw in the Holy Club the "first rise" of Methodism. Club members rigorously self-examined themselves each day with these 22 questions:

1. Am I consciously or unconsciously creating the impression that I am better than I really am? In other words, am I a hypocrite? 2. Am I honest in all my acts and words, or do I exaggerate? 3. Do I confidentially pass on to others what has been said to me in confidence? 4. Can I be trusted? 5. Am I a slave to dress, friends, work or habits? 6. Am I self-conscious, self-pitying, or self-justifying? 7. Did the Bible live in me today? 8. Do I give the Bible time to speak to me every day? 9. Am I enjoying prayer? 10. When did I last speak to someone else of my faith? 11. Do I pray about the money I spend? 12. Do I get to bed on time and get up on time? 13. Do I disobey God in anything? 14. Do I insist upon doing something about which my conscience is uneasy? 15. Am I defeated in any part of my life? 16. Am I jealous, impure, critical, irritable, touchy or distrustful? 17. How do I spend my spare time? 18. Am I proud? 19. Do I thank God that I am not as other people, especially as the Pharisees who despised the publican? 20. Is there anyone whom I fear, dislike, disown, criticize, hold a resentment toward or disregard? If so, what am I doing about it? 21. Do I grumble or complain constantly? 22. Is Christ real to me?

These questions, asked of ourselves sincerely and regularly, can aid in stemming the growth of sin in our hearts so that Christ might fully reign. With the aid of the Holy Spirit as we study God's Word and put it into practice each day, I truly believe that an entire church, community, and world can be revived and transformed to the glory of God!

Blessing of the Pets Our Annual Blessing of the Pets will be

held on **Monday, October 2nd at 6 p.m. at VUMC** in the field on the south side of the building (weather permitting). All pets and their owners are welcome! Always a fun and meaningful event. This year we are working again with Salem Evangelical Lutheran Church and Aisle 7 Fellowship in a combined event. We ask that you make sure your pet is securely leashed or caged for their own safety.

What Do People Do at a Blessing of the Pets? Many people bring their pets to be blessed on the week of St Francis' feast day because of his love for animals. Our services include a verbal blessing and are held in the field next to our church building where different animals can gather. Blessings may occur indoors or outdoors, depending on the weather. Relief Donations Approach \$10,000

VUMC members have donated almost \$10,000 in September to UMCOR's Domestic Disaster Relief fund. 100% of these funds will be used to aid victims of Hurricanes Harvey and Irma (and any other hurricanes that effect the U.S. during this hurricane season).

42 Flood Buckets valued at \$2,800 donated by VUMC members

42 five-gallon flood buckets (also known as cleaning buckets) were donated by VUMC members in September as part of a Virginia Conference-wide drive. An estimated 1,000 buckets were collected from the conferences 1100 churches. The buckets contain cleaning supplies from sponges to trash bags to cleaning detergent.

Funds Have Been Raised for Showers at the Verona Community Center



With your help (and the help of the some local donors from the community who provide matching funds for the money raised at Verona UMC) showers will soon be installed and operating at the Verona Community Center. The

plumbing is already roughed in and the \$3,000 raised will allow us to complete the installation.

Why Showers?

Showering may not seem like a luxury but for someone who has fallen on hard times it might be something they simply are not able to do. There are a number of situations that someone who takes advantage of the ministry might be experiencing. They may have running water in their kitchen but due to plumbing problems have no water in the bathroom. They may have been evicted or have no home to take a shower in.

There are also mission teams traveling through the area who can take advantage of the showers as well as the future possibility of the community center serving as a disaster relief center in the event of flooding or another natural disaster.

The showers will be open during special hours during the week. Toiletries will be provided at the center for persons who come without soap, shampoo, etc. Volunteers will be specially trained to manage the ministry during the special hours the showers are open during the week.

Magazine Article Highlights VUMC's History

The October issue of the Virginia Advocate featured several churches who have integrated their churches' histories into their present-day mission. The following is excerpted from the three-page article on our own church's efforts....

The Rev. Bob Weeks, senior pastor at Verona UMC in the Harrisonburg District, is a lover of church history, and at his church the congregation has connected the past to the present.

One of the ways they have done this is by making practical and symbolic use of an old railroad lantern used to light the 1870s community washhouse where the church first met 140 years ago. Last year the Church transformed an old grocery store into the new Verona Community Center and planted a new worship community named Aisle 7 Fellowship. At the dedication of the community center in March 2016, the now electrically-wired lantern was hung in the center of the entryway. The lantern is left permanently on as a sign of the light the church hopes the center will be for

Weeks answers some questions below about the church and their connection with their history: *Why* do you think it's important to preserve church history? "There are a multitude of reasons. The foremost

is that our church's story is not simply about our present reality and the hope of what is to come. The Scripture grounds all that we are and will be in the stories of our past. We are woefully ill-equipped to move through the present and into the future unless we have learned not only the biblical stories of our faith, but also the stories that connect us to our more recent past."

"Preserving church history can also help us overcome an unfortunate malady of the church in 21st century America. We are a generation that increasingly longs to eliminate all risk, to move only when and where there is absolute certainty. But in our congregation's history there is story after story of people of faith taking risks for the sake of the Gospel. In 140 years we have met in five different locations. We have planted churches. We have been part of multipoint charges and found our way to status as a station church. We have been United Brethren, Evangelical United Brethren and now United Methodist. The community around us has changed so much that the majority of buildings and businesses that were here a half century ago no longer exist."

"Through wars and depressions and cultural revolutions, the church of Jesus Christ in Verona has pressed on with a message of hope in the midst of change. Preserving the stories of our church and community provide us with context, inspiration and strength for what lies ahead."




