One year ago, an elementary school in Africa had an average attendance of 200. Then Stop Hunger Now promised daily luncheons for every student attending the school. Within two months, the attendance grew to 1200 because the parents wanted their children to get a good lunch. That is one thousand children getting an education that they were missing just because they were also getting a good lunch every day. Harrisonburg District churches are a part of this miraculous commitment to feed the world and End Hunger Now. On Sunday, April 21st, the members of Asbury Church in Harri-

sonburg will gather to assemble lunch bags and on Sunday, March 17, members and friends of Keezletown Church gathered and assembled 20,686 meals in two hours. (Please see pictures.) They also raised \$5,200 in two weeks to pay the costs of the endeavor.



The impetus behind the Keezletown Church project is a church member named Tanya Dawn Eppard who was moved by the Stop Hunger lunch-a-thon one year at Annual Conference. Since then she has led one at Keezletown each year for the past three years during which over 70,000 meals were assembled.



I attended the Keezletown event this year and was very impressed by a number of things, primarily the number and wide range of ages among the people involved, the organiza-

tion system established by Stop Hunger Now, and the energy and camaraderie of the folks while they worked.

It would be a wonderful mission activity for your church and I commend it to you.


