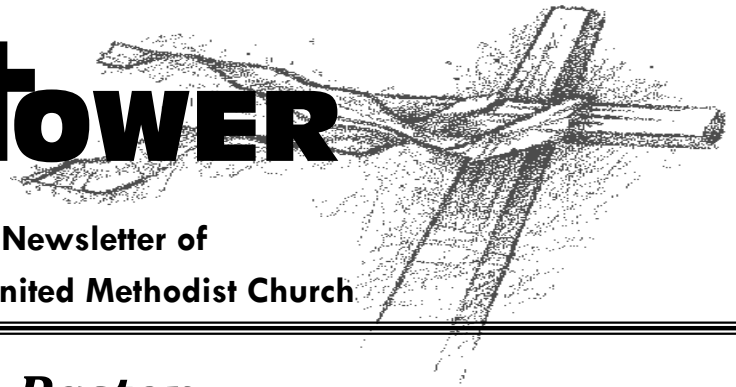

NEW MINISTRY SITE REPORT During July and August we'll be talking a good deal about a potential new ministry and worship site in Verona. The site, recommended by our New Ministry Site Committee, is a highly visible, 8,200 square-foot former storefront between Dollar General and Goodwill. We hope that with God's blessing and as He opens the doors, a community center will be established to house both a second campus for our church and outreach ministries to the community.

Many, many hours by our church leaders have gone into researching and praying about this proposal. We anticipate significant financial support from a number of sources, including programs of the United Methodist Church devoted to supporting new church plants and community outreach initiatives. We also are developing partnerships with other churches and local organizations who will be given the opportunity to make use of the proposed community center.

At this time, we hope to have a Church Council decision in July and, if the Church Council supports the proposal for a new ministry site, a Church Conference in August to make a final decision. If you have questions, please do not hesitate to contact me.

KEEP PRAYING FOR REVIVAL I believe that what we do matters both now and for all eternity. When we pray for the revival of the Church, we are praying that God's Spirit will flow freely through our lives so that others might come to hear the message of salvation and turn back to God. May God unleash His Spirit and cause us to fall in love again with His Word, that the Church might burn brightly with His truth.

Doug May, Bob Weeks to Attend UMC's School of Congregational Development in Indiana

With funds from the Virginia Conference of The UMC covering airfare and lodging, Outreach Chairperson Doug May and Pastor Bob Weeks will travel to Indianapolis from August 13 to 16 for the UMC's "School of Congregational Development."

The School of Congregational Development is a premier event for equipping conference leaders, clergy, and laity to lead vital, dynamic, life-changing congregations. Hosted by the Indiana Conference, this year's focus is on Crossroads, where community, culture, and faith come together to offer the message of love and grace as found in Jesus Christ. Workshops will focus on multi-campus churches, community outreach, and innovate ministry.

Pastor Bob Returns for 5th Year

Our Senior Pastor Bob Weeks will return for a 5th year after being reappointed to Verona UMC by Bishop Cho. Bob and Lydia came to Verona in July of 2011 from his previous appointment at New Creation UMC in Chesapeake, Virginia.

The United Methodist Church has a "sent" system of appointments. Unlike the "called" system used by most denominations where local churches interview and hire a pastor, United Methodist pastors are sent by the bishop after he or she has consulted with the local church's Staff-Parish Relations Committee and the Conference's District Superintendents.

United Methodist Pastors serve one year at a time. In the past it was common for a pastor to remain at a church for only two to four years. The trend over the past few decades has been for pastors to serve longer appointments, due primarily to the realization that longer pastorates result in healthier churches.

If you want your church to become an expanding one, go back to the basics: learn how to pray and worship, learn to read the Bible and live by the ideal of Jesus, then learn to love one another and the lost. Build a culture that says that lost people matter to God. When you do that, you and your fellow members will have evangelistic visions that see opportunity to share Jesus everywhere you go and under all circumstances and situations. - S. Joseph Kidder

Our Youth Mission Trip: Why Greenwood, South Carolina?

From June 27 through July 4th, over 40 of our VUMC youth and their leaders will go as "ambassadors of Christ" from our congregation to help Greenwood's poorest citizens. In addition to making repairs and improvements to local housing, mission team members will make friends and share Christ's love.

Located in the western part of South Carolina, Greenwood was once a thriving city about the size of Staunton, Virginia. Nicknamed the "Emerald City" for its green landscape and known for its barbecue and friendliness, the city once thrived. Like Staunton, the city has an historic downtown area that draws tourists. In the last decade, however, Greenwood and its surrounding county experienced the sharpest economic decline, according to poverty rates, of any county in the United States (from a 2011 article in the *New York Times*).

One of the contributing factors to this decline was the deindustrialization of the textile mills that at one time supported the economy of Greenwood. Over time, a large majority of the textile mills were shut down which eliminated numerous jobs from the Greenwood community. Many of the middle-income citizens in Greenwood also experienced lay offs and cutbacks due to the recession; as a result, many of these middle-class individuals were forced to settle for jobs that they would not ordinarily take. This, in turn, took jobs that would have been available to poorer, less educated workers.

Please keep our Youth Mission Team and the people of Greenwood in your prayers.

Annual Conference Delegate to Report to VUMC on July 19

Doug MacTavish will present a 5-minute summary of our recent Annual Conference of The Virginia United Methodist Church at both worship services on July 19. The Annual Conference, held in Roanoke on June 19-21, was attended by almost four thousand clergy and lay delegates from every congregation. This year's primary task was the election of 11 clergy delegates and 11 lay delegates to next year's General Conference of The United Methodist Church to be held in Portland, Oregon. The General Conference is the UMC's worldwide decision-making body.

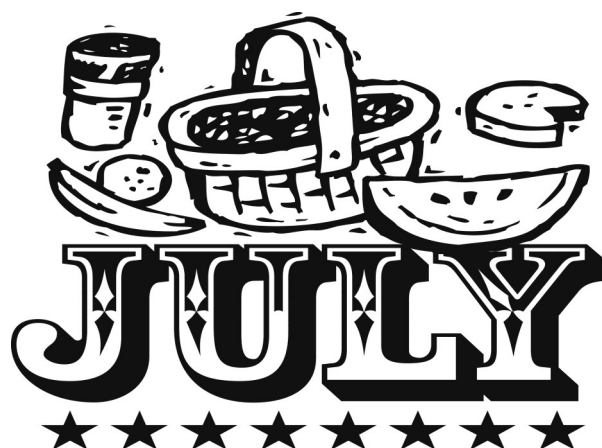

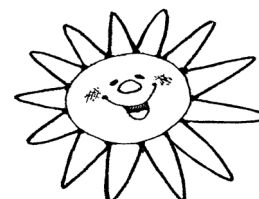
