From the Pastor

There's an old, old saying: "Know thine enemy." With so many temptations today for pastors to keep their sermons "positive," I'm not sure how well we know the primary enemy of humanity; or how this adversary operates to draw us away from God and into dysfunction and brokenness.

For the six Sundays of Lent I've prepared a sermon series entitled ""Not the Way It's Supposed to Be." That title is taken from one of the most readable and

impactful books on the nature of sin I've ever read. Assigned the book in a class at Duke Divinity School, my vision of the nature of sin and the glorious riches of God's grace was changed forever by author Cornelius Plantinga, Jr.

What you tolerate today will dominate you tomorrow.

On Sunday mornings, and at our Pastor's Bible Study on Sunday evenings, we'll explore why we cannot begin to appreciate God's grace until we under-

stand the extent and destructive nature of our sin. By identifying the various ways sin invades our lives—and the ways we tolerate and even cultivate it—my ultimate hope is that through the cross of Jesus Christ the Holy Spirit can transform and restore our souls to the state God originally intended.

A famous violinist named Joshua Bell once played for 45 minutes in a D.C. subway station. Though he played a \$3 million violin and had sold out a Boston theater just two nights before, only six people stopped to listen to his music.

Who are the celebrities around us? Is it possible that someone on a mission from God is in our midst, but we don't recognize them? God can speak through "the least of these" among us but the sad fact is that often we're not listening. We're in too much of a hurry to pay attention. Or we deem someone too young or too old; too poor or too uneducated; too plain or too strange.

The prophet Isaiah once said that there was nothing about Jesus that should attract us to him (Isaiah 53:2). In other words, judging by appearances, we might have ignored him if he had walked down our street. Let's do our best to notice the people who cross our paths each day. They may be angels in disguise!

Disaster Relief Mission Trip Plans are being finalized for the Mission Trip to South Carolina. We will be leaving the church after the early service on Sun. Feb. 21 and returning around 5pm on Sat. Online Giving Now Available

It's easy, safe and secure. Go to the church website (veronaumc.com) and click on the online giving banner OR drop by the church office during the week and Shawna can assist you in setting up your online giving.

It is also helpful for those who dislike writing checks—just a few minutes at your computer and you can set up your donations to be repeated for as long as you like. You can use a credit card, debit card, or e-check and donate to our church's general fund, youth or adult missions, organ fund, the new Verona community center, Aisle 7 Fellowship, or other special church funds.

Important note: when you make your donation using an e-check, the cost to the church is 1% of the donation. When you use a credit or debit card, the cost to the church is 3% of the donation. You will be given the option to pay the processing fee for the church.

Ultimate Values

Collectively, Americans owe over \$800 billion in creditcard debt. If credit-card interest rates average between 13 to 15 percent, and many are higher, you don't actually have to do the math to know that the interest charges are astronomical. In fact the average American household with unsecured debt has over \$15,000 in credit-card debt alone. So, how did we reach this point?

In part it is because it is so tempting for us to confuse imagined needs with real needs. The prophet Isaiah cautions us, "Why spend money on what is not bread, and your labor on what does not satisfy? Listen to me, and eat what is good, and you will delight in the richest of fare." - Isa.55:2

Jesus warned repeatedly, "'Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions'" (Luke 12:15). Jesus was prophetic even for the 21st century in his admonition to keep one's guard up. If I have been "window shopping" online, the next time I open Facebook, the retailer whose site or product I had perused repeatedly shows up as a sponsored ad on my newsfeed, sometimes with a tailored ad featuring the exact product I had been looking at. The next time I perform a search on Google, the search-results page jumps in on the action as well.

We have allowed ourselves to be sucked into the consumerism vortex and can soon convince ourselves that almost all of our wants are needs..... Americans spend \$370 million a year on pet costumes. We spend \$5 billion a year on entertaining ringtones. Perhaps ringtones and pet costumes are not your area of weakness. I suspect you could name something that is, something that may very well be considered as foolish in the eyes of others....

There is no clearer indicator of our ultimate values than our financial priorities and practices — how we spend, how we live, how we save and how we give reveal the true altar of our hearts....

Other rooms will be dedicated to youth, children, and small group meetings.




