There are a lot of things we accept on faith. Things that make sense but which we cannot personally prove. To make it through life, we have to sometimes trust people—and yes, governments—that we believe are trustworthy.

Report to VUMC Council - March 22, 2016

The Verona Community Center Management Board elected by this Church Council in January has met three times since. Members are: Keira Riccioni (Vice-Chair), Rosalyn Carper, Judith Cariker (Chair), Rev. John Crawford, Doug Houff, Bobbie Howell (Secretary), Matt Dietz, and Rev. Ed Pruitt. Ex-officio members are Rev. Bob Weeks, Rev. Kevin McMullen, and Fred Wills

We have set up four committees: Volunteer Corps Recruitment and Training, Operations and Programs, Fund Development, and Marketing. A volunteer handbook has been developed and training started. We have applied for two grants so far and a fund development plan is being developed. We are investigating the possibility of collaborating with agencies through the Greater Augusta Prevention Partners Coalition for programming for at-risk youth, parenting, tutoring and seniors.

All aspects of the facility, lease and build-out have been completed under the capable hands of Trustee Fred Wills, Pastor Bob, contractor Randy Sutler and many dedicated volunteers, with only minimal touch-up items left. Volunteers doing the demolition work, painting and other tasks saved us thousands of dollars as did reusing doors, lighting fixtures, etc. Tables, chairs, laptops, and equipment are in place, and Wi-fi and computers have been activated thanks to Doug May.

We received our Occupancy Permit on March 8 and began booking events that evening. As of today, 8 one-time events with potential income of \$1,306, and 7 continuous events with potential income of \$29,800 potential income have been booked. This would be a total of \$31,106. We have several events on some days, but for 284 remaining in 2016, we have 55 days of use already scheduled and requests for use are coming in almost daily. We are delighted to be working with several area churches as well.

The No-Pay Internet Café opened on March 21, and other scheduled activities begin this week; two continuous business meetings on Tuesdays, one during the day and one evening, a Bible study on Thursday evenings for six weeks, a continuous prayer group on Monday evenings, a soon-to-begin continuous Silver Sneakers fitness program on Monday and Wednesday mornings, and a number of one-time events. The Board has every confidence that operations will become self-sustaining very quickly.

At our last meeting of the VCC Management Board, it was unanimously approved to name the auditorium the John Gray Hall in memory of John Gray who operated a grocery store in that space from 1967 to 1997, was an active member of Verona UMC and a generous community supporter.

Our most critical need at this point is for a Person-in-Charge to coordinate all the scheduling of events and volunteers. Please pray with us for that person to be revealed to us.

<u>Financial status</u>: From August the beginning, until March 8, income has totaled \$107,964, and expenses totaled \$171,546 (rent/utilities/supplies \$16,418; remodeling \$155,128), which leaves a deficit of \$63,582. I have issued a Chairman's Challenge for \$63,000 in 63 days, and members are jumping on this as we speak. [Note: several large donations since this report have reduced the deficit by one-third].

It is phenomenal that this project has come to fruition in less than six months, and we are grateful for many dedicated volunteers and donors who have made it happen, with kudos to Fred Wills and Pastor Bob who have spearheaded this God-given mission from Day One, through thick and thin, doors going up and doors coming down!

We are planning a Grand Opening Celebration in May with praise to our awesome God who has made this happen seamlessly.

Honor or Remember a Loved One

You can place flowers on the altar in honor or memory of a loved one on Sunday mornings by using the sign-up sheet on the big bulletin board in the Narthex hallway. Indicate the Sunday you want and call Shawna Hiner at 248-7777 by Wednesday of your week to let her know the type of flower arrangement you prefer and what you want printed in the bulletin. Cost is \$40 made payable to VUMC. Please write "Altar Flowers" in the memo line. You can leave a check in the offering plate or drop off at the office.

April 3: "Food Pantry Sunday"

Every week our food pantry, located in a house behind the church building, supports families lacking the means to adequately feed themselves. We encourage you to bring donations of nonperishable food and personal hygiene items. Currently we are asking for baby wipes, black pepper, canned fruit, plastic bags, toiletry items: shampoo, conditioner, body wash, soap and deodorant. Boxes are located at our church building entrances to receive your donations. You may also make financial donations on that Sunday simply place your checks (or cash in a sealed envelope) in the offering plate. Be sure to note on your donation "VUMC Food Pantry."

Prayer, Witness & Dinner April 24

Our next "PWD" will be Sunday, April 24 at 5:30 pm in the fellowship hall and sanctuary. We will eat with the youth group again- please bring a covered dish to share. All are welcome and encouraged to attend. Contact our church office (248-7777) if you will attend.

Once again our church is providing a Through the Year Bible Reading Plan to our members and friends. Pastor Bob says about this plan:

"The greatest feeling of accomplishment I ever had was when, at the age of 15, I read through the Bible for the first time. I used a plan similar to the one you'll be using with both OT and NT readings each day."



Mission Trip to Kingstree, S.C.

Our Mission Team was comprised of 7 church members: Noah Bussard, Mike Cash, Wayne Smith, Jerry VanLear, Fred Wills, Faye and Larry Wills. The team stayed in facilities provided by the First Baptist Church of Lake City, SC., a large church with showers, a basketball court, a youth game room and a recreation center.

This mission trip turned out to be a little different from our past experiences. The property owner, San Lee, actually worked along with us on several activities. San, whose American name is Michael, was born in Vietnam; he moved to the United States (Oregon) at age 19. He and his wife, Britany, have lived in South Carolina for 16 years. They have 3 children: Edward—15; Ralph – 12; and Leon – 8. Their home is located in Kingstree, SC about 15 minutes away from the church in Lake City.

As you recall, the flooding occurred in late September 2015. All of the flooding in Kingstree was from the Black River cresting. Flood stage for the Black River is 12'; the river crested at 22'. This was the worst flooding since 1973. The home received 4' of water above the front porch which is about 3+ feet above ground level. Further, it has rained 1-2 inches each week since the flood. Several inches of water are still across the road below Michael's home.

The work performed by the team included:

- Placed tile in the kitchen and hallway
- Rehung several doors throughout the house, included installing trim around the door. Since each door was different this became a very slow and exacting process.
- Installed Levelor blinds over a large window
- Installed laminate flooring in bathroom closet
- Installed bi-fold doors in pantry
- Repaired storm windows
- Replaced storm door on front of house
- Installed electrical box in living room

Faye Wills was our own personal chief. We ate very well and each of us thanks her for her contributions to our mission trip. All in all, the team had a very successful, but tiring week.

The team would like to thank the congregation for their prayers and support before and during the trip. We especially want to thank our individual prayer partners who payed daily for us during the time we were there. We also want to thank those who supported us financially. Without your support these types of trips would not be possible.




