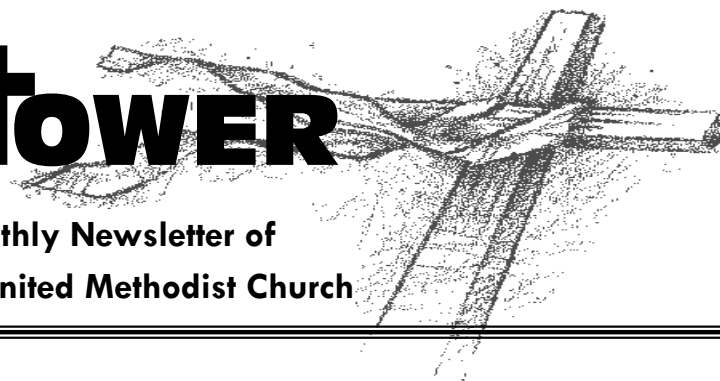

From the Pastor

It's summertime! With vacations, gardens, and outdoor activities, it's easy to feel like we're pulled in a hundred different directions. That's why it's important to remember the things that keep our lives centered in Christ: 1) Prayer; 2) Spending time in God's Word; 3) Worshiping with the family of God; 4) Enjoying and loving the people God has placed in our lives. I hope we'll all have a safe and rejuvenating summer—physically, mentally, and spiritually.

I recently checked my email and saw the following message from Pastor Randy Duncan of New Creation UMC in Chesapeake (where I served before coming to Verona). I thought I'd share it with you as a timely reminder that life isn't simply "a cruise to nowhere."

"Where are you going on your summer vacation? Maybe you will be visiting family. Maybe a trip to the beach. Perhaps a trip over seas to another country. Maybe like my family, a trip to Florida and a visit with Mickey Mouse.

If you've ever lived near the ocean maybe you have seen advertisements for "cruises to nowhere." Maybe you've even been on one. People get on board a cruise ship, and when they leave the pier, instead of setting out for a lush island or other exotic location, they go out to sea and travel in circles for a couple of days. Meanwhile they dine on sumptuous meals, lounge around the pool, enjoy shows, and participate in onboard activities.

The problem for a lot of churches is that they operate much too much like those cruises. They're on a trip with no destination, no charted course. They're in a holding pattern, and they occupy their time pursuing pleasures or engaging in activities that don't have any lasting benefit or have significant impact for themselves or others. Meanwhile, they travel in circles. In the end they finish no better than they started. A cruise to nowhere may be a fun way to occupy a few days of vacation time, but it's no way to do church." - Pastor Randy Duncan, New Creation UMC

I believe Pastor Randy's analogy of churches on a "cruise to nowhere" applies not only to congregations but also to individual followers of Christ. Does life have a point, a destination other than the grave? Are our hopes and dreams fixed on God's Kingdom and Heaven? Are we asking God to lift us up "on higher ground"? During our summer vacations and activities, let's not forget the one "in whom we live, move and have our being (Acts 17:28).

APPOINTMENT AS YOUR PASTOR—Every spring United Methodist Churches throughout the United States go through a process of appointing pastors to churches which best fit their gifts and talents. On July 1st Lydia and I will begin our sixth year with the Verona church. I cannot begin to tell you how blessed we feel to be here. Thank you for the love and grace you have shared with our family.

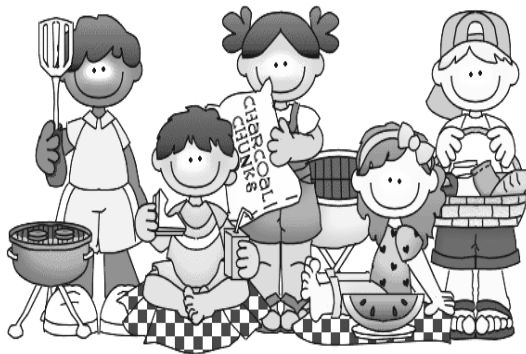

Please Pray for UM Pastors and Their Churches

Moving day for churches in the Virginia Conference receiving new pastors is June 29 and the first Sunday for these pastors will be July 3. I hope each of us will keep these pastors and church in our prayers for safe travels and fruitful ministries together.

Virginia to Receive a New Bishop

Bishop Young Jin Cho will retire from active ministry on August 31 after having served four years as the episcopal leader of the Virginia Conference. To honor his service, the conference Committee on Episcopacy is inviting Virginia United Methodists to make contributions to the Bishop's Foundation endowment to fund training and leadership development for clergy and laity in the area of "Spiritual Leadership."

"In the four years he has been leading our conference, Bishop Cho has consistently emphasized the need for increased prayer and a commitment to spiritual disciplines," said Shirley Cauffman, Committee on Episcopacy chair, "so it seems appropriate to honor him by continuing an emphasis on spiritual disciplines through the work of the Bishops Foundation."

Kevin McMullen Receives License

Aisle 7 Fellowship Campus Pastor Kevin McMullen recently became a Licensed Local Pastor in The United Methodist Church. After completing Licensing School at Virginia Wesleyan College, Kevin attended the Virginia UMC Annual Conference in Roanoke June 17-19. During the conference his licensing, along with 30 other new pastors, was approved by the hundreds of ordained pastors in attendance.

Licensed Local Pastors have many of the same pastoral responsibilities as ordained pastors. Kevin will eventually complete seminary and will enter the process of becoming an ordained Elder in The United Methodist Church.

Bob Weeks Named to Conference Board of Ordained Ministry

VUMC Pastor Bob Weeks has been named to the Virginia Conference Board of Ordained Ministry. The Board is responsible for supporting persons responding to God's call to professional ministry as an elder in full connection, deacon in full connection, associate member, licensed local pastor, diaconal minister, or certified professional in a variety of Christian ministries.

The Board, working with District Committees on Ordained Ministry, reviews the educational and personal qualifications of candidates, including personal interviews, from certified candidacy to ordination or licensing. The Board works collaboratively with the Cabinet in a number of areas to assist in advancing the vision of the Virginia Conference.

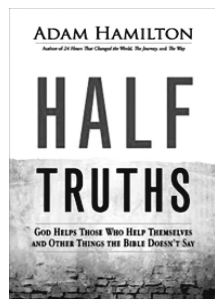
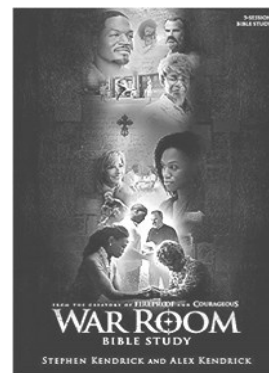

War Room Bible Study (and full movie DVD and hardcover book) by Stephen Kendrick and Alex Kendrick. *War Room Bible Study Book* includes 5 scriptural lessons and movie clips found in the new Kendrick Brothers' movie *War Room*. This short series provides a variety of heart-felt and/or humorous movie scenes and Bible study sessions that can be used in a corporate church message series or a small group Bible study setting. Session topics include: Dealing with Spiritual Lukewarmness, Christian Accountability, Grasping Grace and the Gospel, Engaging in Spiritual Warfare, and Trusting God in Prayer.



Half Truths by Adam Hamilton, 2016 (DVD, Leaders and student books, and Youth Leaders and Student books). Adam Hamilton explores popular sayings that miss the point. Before we were introduced, though, the Bishop announced that there were nine United Methodist churches in the Virginia Conference that no longer existed. Nine once vital congregations had decided to close their doors. Years of decline and stagnation had sealed their fate.

I knew several of those churches personally. I had walked through their doors and met their members. Needless to say, it was a bittersweet moment for me to sit there and see the photos of those churches roll by on the screen, even as we were preparing to have the Conference officially recognize the birth of Aisle 7 Fellowship.

Nine churches closed that day. Only two were born.

Our church in Verona made a decision last August that we would fight against the tide of decline that has led to the disappearance of so many Christian fellowships. It was a bold and faithful decision to trust in God's leading and providence. It was a commitment that will require years of sacrifice and hard work. It was a declaration that we would "not go silently into that good night."

I want to thank each and every member of our church family for your faithfulness to the message of the Gospel. I do not know the specifics of our future. I do not know if one day our church will be among those whose closing is announced at an annual conference. But I do know that I am humbled to be the pastor of a church that takes God's Word seriously, trusts in God's saving power, and longs to make an eternal difference in the Kingdom of God.

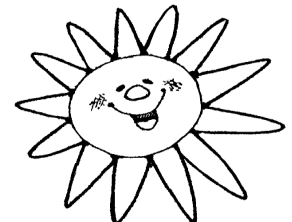

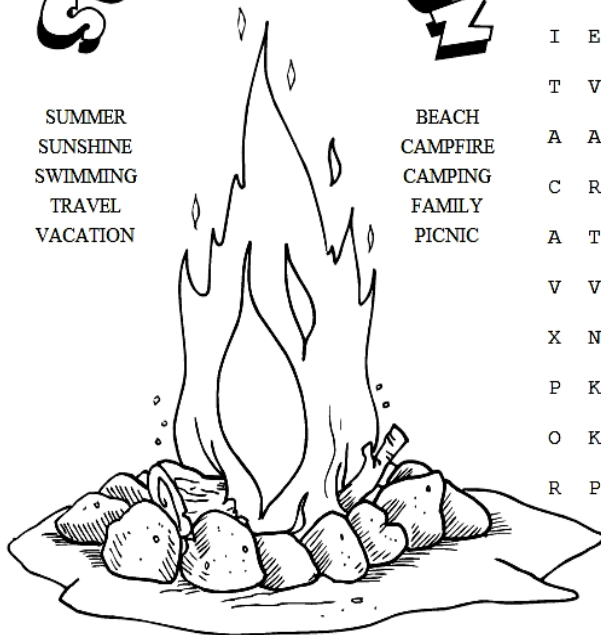
