From the Senior Pastor

Because of You— Primarily due to the generosity of this congregation, the Verona Community Center continues to grow in its service to our community. It is the home for our Aisle 7 Fellowship and according to a recent report from VCC Board of Directors Chairperson Judith Cariker, after 2 years of operation, the center has served 28,634 guests in the cafe and at 967 events!

Thanks to your donations, the laundry has been used over 50 times since installation last fall. Showers installed several weeks ago have been used 61 times, 60 of those times by the mission team from the University of Missouri which slept and ate at Verona UMC during Holy Week while working with Project Grows. The community center continues to serve individuals and groups from every part of the Verona community.

Series of Sermons on The Book of Acts Continues—Our three-month sermon series on the book of Acts is off to a great start. As a companion to our sermon series, I whole heartedly recommend the movie "Paul the Apostle" to you as a poignant way to relate to the imprisonment of Paul and the persecution of the early Christians in Rome. While the movie doesn't employ the usual techniques employed to entertain audiences, I'll admit that by the end of the movie I was both inspired and moved to tears! Acts is the story of the early church expanding God's Kingdom into much of the known world by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Give Thanks—It's been an interesting beginning to spring! Cold and warm fronts are fighting for dominance—snow in mid-April is followed by temperatures in the mid-70's. Trees and flowers are blooming but are prepared to retreat if a frost descends in the early dawn hours. The world as God created it is an amazing dance of life as the gray of winter gives way to the colors of spring. This would be a good moment to say a pray of thanks to our Creator for the wonder of it all!

Pastoral Appointments and Staff Positions— Within a week or so we'll be announcing a new pastoral appointment for Aisle 7 Fellowship. In addition, with Shawna Hiner and Ethan Eldred leaving their staff positions, we have openings for our Church Office Administrator and Aisle 7 Worship Leader respectively. Please keep the hiring committees appointed by the Staff-Parish Relations Committee in your prayers as well as Shawna, Ethan, and Kevin McMullen.

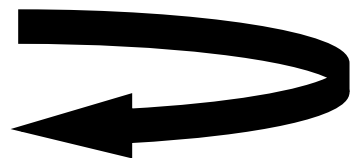

The trailer in Meade's Trailer Park, purchased with donations from VUMC members in 2012, will now be used in a trial transitional housing ministry headed up by members of our Aisle 7 Campus. For five years Barbara and Earl Morris, VUMC members, lived in the trailer rent free while paying the lot fee and utilities. After Earl's death and Barbara's move to live with her son in Goshen, the trailer became available again. The VUMC Church Council recently approved Aisle 7's proposal for use of the program to aid people seeking a short-term housing solution while working toward permanent housing. ACTS—HOLY BOLDNESS

Author and Purpose

Acts is a sequel to the Gospel of Luke. Both were written by Luke, a physician who traveled with the apostle Paul. Luke's purpose for writing his Gospel (see Luke 1:3–4) applies to Acts as well: to give an "orderly" account of the early church after Christ's resurrection. Acts is a historical account of how the resurrection of Jesus changes everything through the birth of the early church.

Geographical Expansion Acts is the story of God's grace flooding out to the world. Nothing is more prominent in Acts than the spread of the gospel. Jesus promises a geographic expansion at the outset (Acts 1:8), and Acts follows the news of his death and resurrection as it spreads from Jerusalem to Judea, Samaria, and the faraway capital of Rome.

Preaching The preaching of Jesus' death and resurrection is central in Acts. The Greek verb for "preach the gospel" (euangelizo) occurs more in this book than in any other in the New Testament. About a third of the book of Acts consists of speeches, and most are speeches of Peter or Paul proclaiming the gospel. The good news of the salvation accomplished in Christ and applied by the Holy Spirit extends to the "ends of the earth" through preaching.

God is central to the gospel's expansion. He is at the heart of the gospel message, the news that reconciliation with the Father is now possible through Jesus Christ. God the Holy Spirit is responsible for the growth of the church and its remarkable expansion.

God's Passionate Pursuit In Acts, "grace" is a parallel for "the gospel" or "salvation." Jesus' message is summarized as "the word of his grace," believers are said to have received "grace" or to be "full of grace," and they are challenged to continue in "grace." The missionaries in Acts proclaim the grace of God, and it is through this grace that people are able to respond with faith.

Acts reveals God's passionate pursuit of his people, beginning with his followers in Jerusalem, expanding to Samaria, then to the rest of the world. By the end of the book we see Paul living in Rome "proclaiming the kingdom of God and teaching about the Lord Jesus Christ with all boldness and without hindrance" (Acts 28:31). The gospel draws people in, constitutes them as the church centered on the grace of Jesus, and then sends them out in mission to the world. The new group of believers is marked by the Holy Spirit, who creates such a distinctive community that others are drawn in, experiencing God's grace.

Barriers, Weakness, Opposition, and Persecution

The gospel spreads despite barriers of geography, ethnicity, culture, gender, and wealth. Many of these

barriers appear so inviolable that when the gospel is preached to a new segment of society, riots ensue. But Luke makes clear that no one is beyond the scope of God's saving power, nor is anyone exempt from the need for God's redeeming grace.

In Acts, the gospel expands not through human strength, but through weakness, opposition, and persecution. Demonic forces, worldly powers and authorities, governmental opposition, language and cultural barriers, intense suffering and bloody persecution, unjust imprisonment, unbelief, internal disunity, and even shipwrecks and snakes all threaten to slow down the gospel's advance. But opposition and suffering do not thwart the spread of Jesus' grace; rather, they only fuel it.

Acts and the Rest of the Bible Acts shows that the new Christian movement is not a fringe sect, but the culmination of God's plan of redemption. What was seen only as shadows in the Old Testament, God reveals finally and fully through Jesus Christ. The book of Acts does not primarily provide us with human patterns to emulate or avoid. Instead, it repeatedly calls us to reflect upon the work of God, fulfilled in Jesus Christ, establishing the church by the power of the Holy Spirit.

The gospel's expansion is the culmination of what God has been doing since the beginning. Acts consistently grounds salvation in the ancient purpose of God, which comes to fruition at God's own initiative. This reveals God to be the great benefactor who pours out blessings on all people. Even the opportunity to repent is God's gift. - Justin S. Holcomb

Greetings from Aisle 7

Each day we face the possibility of change; change in ourselves, change in others, even change in our environment. Our faith changes over time too. Which leads me to ponder: So how do Christians grow? Well, in the same way we became Christians, right? Okay Kevin, I'll bite- so how did we become Christians? How was it even possible? Well, in Galatians 3, Paul powerfully reminds us that we are Christians because of Jesus's crucifixion and the faith we have in His promises.

Christ's death and resurrection is the single most important element of our faith and is what defines us and changes us. This is what we celebrate each Easter because without Christ's death and new life, we would have no hope for eternal life in the presence of a loving, but just, God. This is what we are currently exploring at Aisle 7: eternal life (heaven and hell) and the challenge to live boldly in the Gospel as Paul wrote to us in Galatians.

Each of us will experience an eternity beyond the physical bodies we inhabit now, and there is only one thing that will determine if eternity spent is in darkness and pain, or in the love and light of our Creator. That one thing is: Jesus Christ and Him crucified.

Looking back a few weeks, Easter service was beautiful as we joyfully proclaimed He is Risen! I think the celebration of the resurrection was heightened for me because our church also celebrated Passover and shared a Seder meal - where we recounted the blessings of our Lord throughout the Old and New Testaments. Just as the Israelites celebrated Passover to remember their deliverance from Egypt, we celebrate Easter daily because we should never forget the power of Christ's sacrifice. We need to be reminded daily of the forgiveness and second chances we get each morning.

In other news at Aisle 7, here's a quick update with the church trailer across the street at Meade's Trailer Park. For those that don't know, we (Verona UMC and Aisle 7) decided in February to invest in the ability to provide a safe, loving home to families in need of temporary housing. To date, we have installed new flooring, painted walls, replaced the ceiling in the bathroom, replaced the toilet, painted kitchen cabinets, installed new baseboard heaters throughout, and did several other repairs. We are hopeful to have the trailer "move-in ready" by the end of April.

Please don't hesitate to speak to me if you feel called to help us out or if anything is weighing on your heart; my door is always open. And we welcome you to visit us some Sunday morning!

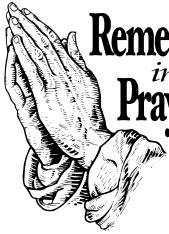
Helping Hands Ministry
