# In Response to the 2019 General Conference of The UMC

February 27, 2019

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ at Verona,

I know that some of you are deeply hurt by the adoption of the Traditional Plan at the recent General Conference of The United Methodist Church. Others are firm in their belief that the outcome was a faithful response to the challenges facing our global denomination over issues of human sexuality, church discipline, and biblical authority. I confess my own feelings of inadequacy in bringing either comfort or deep wisdom to this situation. What I do know without doubt is that I love this church and I love every member of it, regardless of the issues where we might not see eye to eye.

I want to share with you a passage of Scripture that I hope will speak to all of us, no matter where our hearts and minds may be following the General Conference. It is a favorite passage of mine because it reminds me that following Jesus is not always easy—in fact, it can sometimes be devastatingly difficult. I admit that I can sympathize with those in this passage who find Jesus' teachings difficult and walk away from him; I can also sympathize with Peter who, along with the Twelve, remains with Jesus. Jesus asks his disciples "You do not want to leave too, do you?" And Peter answers him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

I pray this day that none of us will allow the events of the past few days to lessen our faith in Jesus Christ and his promises. He has the words of eternal life and in those words is healing beyond our imagining.

Every Sunday morning at VUMC we sing, *"I'm so glad I'm a part of the family of God."* I will always be thankful to God that I am—with you—a part of the family of God in Verona.

#### TO WHOM SHALL WE GO? (John 6:41-69)

41 At this the Jews there began to grumble about him because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." 42 They said, "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I came down from heaven'?"

43 "Stop grumbling among yourselves," Jesus answered. 44 "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them, and I will raise them up at the last day. 45 It is written in the Prophets: 'They will all be taught by God.' Everyone who has heard the Father and learned from him comes to me. 46 No one has seen the Father except the one who is from God; only he has seen the Father. 47 Very truly I tell you, the one who believes has eternal life. 48 I am the bread of life. 49 Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, yet they died. 50 But here is the bread that comes down from heaven, which anyone may eat and not die. 51 I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world."

52 Then the Jews began to argue sharply among themselves, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?"

53 Jesus said to them, "Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. 54 Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day. 55 For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. 56 Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them. 57 Just as the living Father sent me and I live because of the Father, so the one who feeds on me will live because of me. 58 This is the bread that came down from heaven. Your ancestors ate manna and died, but whoever feeds on this bread will live forever." 59 He said this while teaching in the synagogue in Capernaum.

60 On hearing it, many of his disciples said, "This is a hard teaching. Who can accept it?"

61 Aware that his disciples were grumbling about this, Jesus said to them, "Does this offend you? 62 Then what if you see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before! 63 The Spirit gives life; the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you—they are full of the Spirit and life. 64 Yet there are some of you who do not believe." For Jesus had knownfrom the beginning which of them did not believe and who would betray him. 65 He went on to say, "This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless the Father has enabled them."

66 From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him. 67 "You do not want to leave too, do you?" Jesus asked the Twelve. 68 Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. 69 We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God."

### A Brief Summary of The Actions of the 2019 General Conference

The General Conference is the legislative body of The United Methodist Church and is comprised of more than 800 delegates from around the world. General Conference generally meets every four years, but met in a special session Feb. 24-26, 2019, in order to deal with matters of ministry of and with lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer people.

The delegates to the regularly-scheduled 2016 General Conference recognized The United Methodist Church is not of one mind when it comes to the ministry of and with LGBTQ people. They asked the United Methodist Council of Bishops to set up a process to figure out a way through this disagreement.

The Council of Bishops then appointed 33 people to The Commission on a Way Forward. Their task was to find a structural solution to this theological disagreement.

The commission presented the Council of Bishops three plans:

*The Connectional Conference Plan* was a massive restructuring of the denomination. *The Traditionalist Plan* further entrenching the denomination's stance on human sexuality. *The One Church Plan* codified the regional differences already present in the denomination.

The *bishops* recommended the One Church Plan. The *delegates to the General Conference* chose the Traditionalist Plan reaffirming the current Book of Discipline in regard to the practice of homosexuality and strengthening the enforcement of the Discipline in this regard. In past years the Discipline's restrictive language regarding same-sex marriage and gay clergy had been increasingly disregarded by certain segments of the church (primarily within the United States) and the passing of the Traditional Plan was in part a response to those actions. *(adapted from the UMC's Board of Church and Society website)*

# From Pastor Bob

question for all the adults reading this—do you remember when you were a child? Memories you can not only see, but you can feel and almost touch.

A lot of my memories revolve around my childhood church. I grew up in what may best be described as a "Simple Church." Simple enough for a child to understand. Simple enough that what is most important didn't get lost in translation.

There are three important things this simple church taught me about God: He is King. His Word is final. And I can trust Him.

Those three beliefs were reinforced in the daily routines of family and church life. - I remember how exciting it was when we had to pull out extra chairs for Sunday morning worship. It meant more people wanted to know Jesus. And knowing Jesus was

what church was all about, right?

- On Sunday evenings our family would pile into our copper-colored Plymouth station wagon and return to the church for worship. Once a month during those Sunday evening services we worked on our congregational singing, learning how to read the notes in our hymnals. After all, my child's heart reasoned, our God deserves our very best praise.

- When we prayed in worship I closed my eyes hard and squeezed my hands together until my knuckles turned white. I wanted God to see how much I wanted my prayers to reach His ears. It was clear to me that my heavenly Father was listening.

- Wednesday evenings we returned to the church for a time of singing and Bible study. In my child's heart, knowing God's will was all that mattered. And knowing His will began with the Bible my parents gave me.

When I was 10 years old I was sure that when Jesus came again he would take my brother and sister and mom and dad to heaven but leave me behind. I had come to this conclusion by counting the number of times I was spanked or confined to my room compared to my siblings. It was obvious I was on thin ice with God.

So on a hot Sunday morning in July I went forward during the hymn "Trust and Obey" to tell everyone—as I shook uncontrollably—that I was trusting in Jesus as my Savior. That same Sunday morning I was baptized into Christ. I came out soaking wet and happy. I was going to heaven with everyone else. But then, slowly but surely, it dawned on me that I was still "Bobby the smart-aleck. "I was still going to break rules and say the wrong things and provoke my teachers' wrath (and God's).

That's when I made the commitment to never sin again. I would hide out from my trouble-making friends and read my Bible.

If Jesus came soon enough my plan would work.

But my self-imposed isolation lasted just three days before I broke down and rejoined my gang. I would just have to trust that God might overlook the blackness of my ten -year-old soul and go easy on me, even if the adults around me didn't.

It was all so simple when I was a child. There are so many days I wish I could go back and be a child again, to live each day in simple faith, laying on my back in the field behind our house and imagining heaven up in the clouds; tightly clutching my hands in prayer and singing songs out of a hymnal as my dad pointed to the words; believing in God just because the Bible told me so.

I'm now 64 years old and I know I can't go back. But I can remember.

So many friends and church members have recently said to me, "It must be hard to be a pastor right now with all the conflicts in our denomination." And they are right. Much of the time church can seem all too hard and life all too complicated.

But God is faithful. During times when I'm ready to throw in the towel He rekindles a flood of memories from my childhood and the decades since. Memories that remind me that life and church don't have to be hard if I will just remember that He is my King, His Word is final, and I can trust Him. As a song I learned long ago says, "Why should I worry? Why should I fret? The Lord God Almighty isn't done with me vet!"



- Showers have been used 161 since their installation in May. Laundry facilities were used 49 times in November, bringing the total for the year to 310.
- We've trained several new volunteers in January.

**Community Center Status** The center has filed for 501-c3non-profit status with the federal government, a step which will allow for donations to the center to be tax-deductible without going through the church. Status was still pending as of January 24th.

In addition, an itemized breakdown of school tuition or conference expenses must be attached to the submitted application. In the event there is a member(s) of our Church who desires to attend an accredited college/graduate school in order to pursue a career in full-time Christian Service, that person may receive from the DICE Fund an amount up to, but not exceeding One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) per year or \$500 each semester.

Additionally, in the event there is a VUMC member who is considering a career in full-time Christian service and wishes to attend a Christian conference or event to explore their commitment, he/she may receive an amount not to exceed \$500 per year to cover their expenses for the conference or event.

Requests for assistance for tuition and books/materials required for classes must be submitted each academic year to the D.I.C.E scholarship committee through the VUMC church office.

### **Donation Processors Needed**

**DUTIES INCLUDE** 

• Counting and posting to accounts all cash and checks collected during the offering at regular services and special events/services or that come into the church during the week. Posting is done in our "Church Windows" accounting software.

- Accurately completing an Excel spreadsheet with all donations to the proper fund/account. This spreadsheet is provided to the treasurer.
- The spreadsheet totals and the items posted in Church Windows are checked and should always match.
- Ensuring that everything is posted correctly so that the Church financial reports and yearly giving statements are accurate.
- Keeping accurate backup documentation copies of checks, giving envelopes and other documentation as needed each week.
- Filling out the deposit slip and taking the deposit to the bank (night deposit box).

**TRAINING IS PROVIDED** on Sunday Mornings downstairs in the Treasurer's office starting at 10 AM. Donation processing normally takes a team of two people about 2 hours to complete. Processing on another day (Monday or Tuesday) is fine after the processors have been fully trained and are confident of the procedures. 
